Llangattock Lockdown 2

Wales is in lockdown once again, and Llangattock is observing the Coronavirus restrictions until November 9th.

The Horseshoe Pub and the Rectory Hotel have been closed by the Welsh Government along with many shops in Crickhowell.

Llangattock Recreation Ground remains open, though we are asking users to observe social distancing rules by staying 2m apart and to wash or sanitise their hands after using the play equipment.

If residents need help during the lockdown, Crickhowell Volunteer Bureau is the designated first point of contact. Community Councillors are happy to signpost people to help, as is Llangattock's County Councillor, Jackie Charlton. TRAFFIC NEWS

With the assistance of our County Councillor, Llangattock Community Council has lobbied the Highways Authority and Costains about traffic flows through the village when the A465 is closed. An informal survey suggested a five-fold increase in traffic, even though Llangattock is not an official diversion route.

Your Community Council also continues to pursue speed reductions at the edges of the village where the evidence supports it. We have provided funding from council reserves to support this and will continue to monitor the legal process of implementing the lower limits.

VANDALISM AT THE PARK

It is with regret that we have to tell you that there have been some incidents of vandalism at Llangattock Recreation Ground. Your council are considering installing CCTV Cameras as both a deterrent and to provide evidence which may lead to prosecution of the person or persons responsible.
