Below are the MINUTES of an extraordinary meeting of Llangattock Community Council on the 29th September 2020 at 7pm. This meeting was held online via Go to Meetings due to current legislation and was open to the public via the link provided on the agenda

Public Participation:

The Clerk gave the Councillors the following from a resident:

- 1) That the new noticeboard in the recreation ground. He had been told by two Councillors that the board had been ordered. He is unhappy that it is not installed.
- 2) The verges along the Dardy, he had been told that the Council had agreed to spending £5-8k on widening the road. Why has this not happened.

Councillors requested that the Clerk respond stating that the noticeboard is in hand, but not ordered and that regarding verges, the Community Council has no knowledge of this spending agreement. Councillors discussed the following:

- That there are issues with two cars passing along The Dardy, there is an issue with parked cars within the area
- That the verges are not in their remit and the Community Council does not have the authority in this area as it lies with Powys County Council

County Councillor Jackie Charlton would be happy to have an ideas regarding the parking issue that has also been raised to her, it is her understanding that the cars are not parked illegally; she is happy to take ideas and liaise with PCSO Billy Dunne. Regarding the verges, the County Council has taken some back already, it might be that the resident is confused on who's remit the verge is, she is happy to talk to the resident about the work that has been completed.

62/20	<p>Memorial Garden – Next Steps (Cllr G Jones)</p> <p>Cllrs G Jones and Cllr A Williams reported on the Memorial Garden</p> <p>They spent a day re-marking and sowing the wildflower seeds still to be completed. They requested if digging could be assisted by Cllr G Dobbs or Cllr J Rees as the ground is stony and hard. Cllr Julian Rees to assist, contact outside of Council meeting. Any turf could then be used for ramps at some point.</p> <p>Plaque is to be completed. Words were agreed and we did have costings earlier. Would not want to get something expensive if we are having thefts. We may well expand the garden towards the original map in the future.</p> <p>Cllr T Jones extended thanks to everyone who has moved this forward.</p> <p>Cllr J Charlton offered a huge thank you to everyone who has moved this on, fantastic to see it taking shape.</p> <p>Cllr J Charlton stated that the plaque from Oak tree is currently missing –maybe replace that one at the other at the same time.</p> <p>Cllr A Williams. Regarding Remembrance Day; the commemorations are on the Sunday, service in evening in Llangattock Church. The School suggested that the school children went to the new Memorial Garden on the 11th and to make this their focus for Remembrance Day. Cllr G Jones stated this was a good thing to do.
