	<p>National Lottery Covid Grant/Shelters + Gates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• New wheelchair accessible gates and an accessibility improvement to the existing gate have been purchased from this grant, in addition to the shelters on the tarmac area. <p>The committee wishes to express its thanks for the quality craftsmanship of Llangattock-based steel fabricators Meyrick and Powell.</p> <p>National Lottery Awards for All/Accessible Toilet:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• After a delay caused by sourcing parts, the toilet should be open by Easter. Thanks go to Cllr Richard Jones for this continuing work on this project. <p>Recreation Ground Signs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Signage at the Recreation Ground has been rationalised, and new signs designed by Cllr Kate Inglis and made by Llangattock signwriter Chris Prior have been installed. <p>Football Wall:</p> <p>A local artist has offered to help paint the wall and suggested that the Council run a competition for ideas of what to go on there.</p>
04/22	<p>Platinum Jubilee Celebrations - Cllr H Burns</p> <p>The Llangattock Village Society is organising two Platinum Jubilee Celebrations at the Rectory Hotel on Thursday, June 2nd, and at the Recreation Ground on Sunday, June 5th. The Community Committee agreed to help publicise these events and spend £50 of its budget allocated to these events on entertainers' expenses.</p> <p>Proposed: Cllr G Jones Seconded: Cllr K Inglis Resolved: to allocate £50.00 for Llangattock Village Society</p> <p>There has been some debate in public as to whether the Council should lift the existing ban on dogs in the Recreation Ground for the Sunday event. 05/22	<p>Defibrillator/Life-saving courses</p> <p>The Committee discussed a fundraising campaign launched by the Llangattock Village Society to purchase two new defibrillators for the village and offer first aid awareness training. The Committee agreed to help promote this campaign.</p>



06/22	Transport/Parking Consultation Place Plan Consultation: The Committee discussed and agreed that the Council should start consultations on a Place Plan for Llangattock, addressing sustainable transport and active travel, parking, a village hall and other matters in the Autumn. Motion: That the Council begins public consultation on a Place Plan for Llangattock in the Autumn. Proposed: Cllr H Burns Seconded: Cllr K Inglis Resolved: to take the motion to full council
07/22	Landfill Disposal Tax Communities Scheme Grant Award <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Landfill Disposals Communities Grant - terms and conditions (circulated yesterday)2. LDCG engagement programme3. Recreation Ground Footpath - surface4. Recreation Ground Footpath - CADW archaeological evaluation5. Recreation Ground Footpath - Tender process. Following the news that the Council has been awarded £49,999 for the above scheme to create an accessible path through the Recreation Ground, the committee set up two working groups to determine which materials should be used and draw up a contract for tenders. The Committee has established that the award falls below the threshold for the most exacting public sector tendering processes and can proceed based on sealed bids and a minimum of three quotes. The committee is also required to deliver public engagement, and biodiversity targets set out in the project bid, and work is beginning on those. The Committee will also apply for a grant from CADW for an archaeological survey of that route closest to the Scheduled Ancient Monument, Garn Goch.
